



Container Trucking Environmental Requirements in effect April 1

The Vancouver Fraser Port Authority (VFPA) is committed to developing a safer, cleaner, more sustainable container truck fleet to service the Port’s container facilities. Beginning April 1, the VFPA will no longer allow access on port property to container trucks older than 1989 unless they meet the Port’s new emissions standards.

The VFPA encourages beneficial cargo owners and companies shipping and/or receiving cargo on behalf of beneficial cargo owners to ensure their motor carrier services meet the new environmental requirements. Please visit www.pacificgatewayportal.com/tlsportal for more information.

TRUCKS THAT DO NOT MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS WILL BE SUSPENDED FROM TLS ON APRIL 1:	
Trucks older than 1989	<p>Will require:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approved Truck Age Exception application • Positive Opacity Result <p>These requirements must be submitted to the TLS Administrator by March 31 for trucks older than 1989 to avoid being banned from the Port.</p>
Trucks older than 1994	Trucks older than 1994 will be banned from port property unless opacity test has been submitted to the TLS Administrator by March 31.
